I will receive an 'in class consequence':


- I might be given a gentle reminder about Green Behaviours

I will be sent to the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher and they will inform my parents...

- I might lose all of my lunchtime with the Deputy or Headteacher
 - I might lose a privilege
 - I might be internally isolated in the Headteacher's office for a morning or afternoon
 - I might be internally isolated in the Headteacher's office for a whole day
 - I might be excluded from school for a fixed period

School Uniform

- In Ash Class, PE is currently on a **Tuesday and Thursday:** Children are asked to come into school wearing full PE kit on these days.
- ➤ Children are not permitted to wear jewellery, make up or nail varnish; this includes non-school uniform days. If any child comes into class with either they will be asked to remove it.
- > Pupils must wear black school shoes with the exception of PE days.
- > Hair accessories should be green, white or black.
- ➤ If your child has pierced ears they may wear one pair of small, plain studs. If they are unable to remover their earrings, please sign a PE consent form at the office.
- ➤ Watches can be worn but pupils may be asked to remove these if they are causing a distraction. Smart watches should not be able to receive messages.

English in Year 1

Key Focuses:

- In terms 1 and 2, the children will be following the Read Write Inc Get Writing program which follows on from our phonics lesson
- Phonics sessions will take place everyday, in small groups.
- We will have a strong focus on handwriting with particular emphasis on forming letters correctly, starting and finishing in the right place.
- Lots of the texts we will be looking at throughout the year will link to our enquiry learning.
- Children will be taught to edit their own creations using 'purple polishing pencils.'
- > Spelling, punctuation and grammar knowledge will be applied to longer pieces of writing to ensure children are aware of language rules. In Year 1, we will be focussing on full stops, capital letters, question marks and exclamation marks.
- The children will enjoy traditional tales and fairy tales, read by an adult, this term. Next term we will be reading The Twits and Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl.

Maths in Year 1

Key focuses:

- The children will be working practically during much of their maths learning. This will allow for a concrete and deeper understanding of new concepts.
